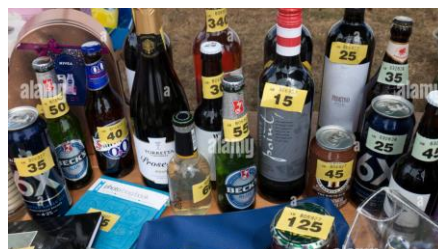

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a very strong start to the Summer Term with an array of hooks and visits to launch the new themes. Visits included the Reception children's first ever school trip to the Tropical Butterfly House and it was a pleasure to listen to the children's happy chatter about all of the creatures they had met on their return!

As a staff we are now working on developing project outcomes that enable the children to contribute to society or to make a difference at the end of a theme. It is important that we are creating opportunities for and empowering the children to develop their leadership skills and to be change makers alongside accessing a curriculum that enables them to think ethically, teaches them about the importance of contributing to wider society and the need to create a better world.

Over the next few weeks, our very youngest children will be planning and conducting a litter pick within our locality, Year Two will be raising awareness about the plight of African elephants, Year Three will be writing to our local MP, Nick Fletcher, voicing their concerns about Planet Earth and Year Five will be listening to a Bee Keeper talk about the plight of the bees and planting wildflowers as a response. We look forward to sharing these outcomes with you in newsletters, on Twitter and on Instagram.

Lastly, it is almost time for our amazing Year Six children to sit their end of Key Stage Two SATS tests (week beginning Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May). I could not be prouder of how hard they have worked this year and of the resilience and determination they have shown. Most of these children have attended weekly boosters since September which is something to be really proud of. Thank you to the incredible efforts of Mr White and Miss Nesbitt in preparing the children for these tests and to Mrs Wiggins for delivering a weekly girls' maths booster session. It has been such a team effort and we are all excited to see how the children perform! They are most definitely ready and prepared!
